She is the author of "At Home in the World: Memoirs of a Traveling Woman" and the newly released "Born with Wings: Experiencing Life in Exotic Lands." Clyde Butcher is a renowned landscape photographer. The exquisite beauty and depth of his work draws the viewer into a relationship with nature. For more than 30 years, he has been preserving the untouched areas of the landscape on film and for 20 of those years, he has concentrated on Florida. Mr. Butcher has won many awards including the Conservation Colleague Award from the Nature Conservancy and the Ansel Adams Conservation Award from the Sierra Club. His photography has been exhibited in museums throughout the United States and Europe. There is no fee for the Studio because it is also a gallery.

Here is some information on the insurance form to be filled out. Everyone needs to have travel insurance as per FFI rules. Travel Guard, which is the one through FFI, is the most reasonable. Go to thefriendshipforce.org and click on Home, scroll down on the left side until you come to Travel Guard insurance. Ramona sent this information to all of us already including how to fill out the form on the Internet. Towards the end it asks you for the tour

Company email. Please use: J.Mahnken@CIETourist.com. Put it exactly as I wrote it, capital letter as noted, small letters as written. Otherwise the insurance company will not accept it. Use May 10 as your trip deposit date.

I sent you all the prices in a previous email.

The travel bureau person here, Mariola, has charged all fees for the airline travel and the tour, so you do not have too many more days to comply with filling out the form in order to cover preexisting conditions.
