Make it a point to seek out these new members and say hello.

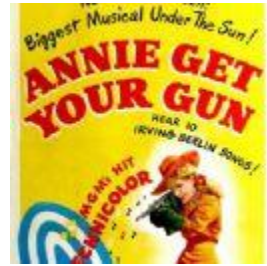
Musical **"Annie Get Your Gun"** at Booker Visual Performing Arts School

FFI World Conference NOLA November 2013

The World Conference was one big party in the city known for never-ending mardi gras. Musical entertainment was wonderful, and the closing gala dinner was followed by a "mardi gras" parade down Bourbon Street. But it was much more than a party too. On the FFI website you will find downloadable photos, videos of musical entertainment, and links to materials shared with attendees in the various plenary sessions and workshops. Here are some of the ideas other clubs have incorporated which impressed me and which our club might want to consider.

- The future of the club is in the community, not in the current members.
- Invite as featured guests at every general meeting the members of one club of the community.
- Ethnic dinners with ethnic groups can lead to more diverse membership.
- Publicizing exchanges to the whole community, inviting guest hosts and guest ambassadors can bring in potential future members.
- Try "speed dating" in languages, splitting time between English and the other language.
- Breakfast scramble, a fun idea to get to know other members better.

•Possible ways to bring in new members from the Next Generation: Use “meetup” online tool to create Next Generation clubs or locate clubs in our community with similar interests to FF. Consider “Hosting Lite”, tandem exchanges and tandem clubs, two 3-day weekends treated as one exchange for fees and management. Sarasota/Orlando to Central Coast, Australia & Whangarei, New Zealand



Sept 29 -October 27, 2014

Departing Florida Sept 29 we arrive in Sydney Oct 1 for 2 nights for an excursion to the Blue Mountains UNESCO World Heritage site as well as free time to explore the city on your own. Two official 5 night homestay exchanges follow: Oct 3 - 8 in Central Coast AUS (north of Sydney), Oct 8 - 13 in Whangarei NZE on the North Island, followed by the FFI World Conference in Auckland. A

fabulous tour of NZE follows the conference including Rotorua and Wellington and the many highlights of the South Island known for its scenic beauty and unique flora and fauna. Optional pre-exchange touring in AUS including the Great Barrier Reef, Daintree Rainforest, Uluru and Kata Tjuta will begin with a departure from Florida Sept 25. Both groups will return to the USA Oct 27.
