Free movies every Thursday in the Academic Center Auditorium at 7:00pm. The listing below is the World Cinema list. Expand your horizons with the best of world cinema; or, get down and dirty with some of Hollywood's classic film noirs. All on the big screen—the way movies were intended to be seen.

Sept. 10: World Cinema

Wild Tales (Damián Szifron, 2014). An Argentine-Spanish black-comedy anthology film composed of six stand-alone shorts united by themes of violence and revenge. The characters display forms of cathartic vengeance and destruction culminating in what the director calls "the undeniable pleasure of losing control." Best Foreign Film nominee.

Sept. 24: World Cinema

Xala (Ousmane Sembène, 1975). "Xala" is Wolo for "temporary sexual impotence." This Senegalese film depicts a businessman cursed with it on the day of his marriage to his third wife. Empire Magazine ranked Xala among the 100 Best Films of World Cinema.

Oct. 8: World Cinema

Picnic at Hanging Rock (Peter Weir, 1975). In remote Australia during the Victorian Era, three students and a teacher from a girls' school vanish without a trace while on a picnic. New Australian Cinema director Weir uses lush cinematography to create a near-mystical story about the chasm between European settlers and the ancient mysteries of their new country. A horror film that looks nothing like a horror film.

Oct. 22: World Cinema

A Separation (Asghar Farhadi, 2011). Oscar winner as Best Foreign Film, 2012. A middle-class Iranian couple separate after 14 years of marriage. They are faced with a difficult decision---to improve the life of their child by moving to another country or to stay in Iran and look after an aging parent succumbing to Alzheimer's.

Nov. 5: World Cinema

After Life. (Hirokazu Koreeda, 1998). The newly dead spend a week in the Japanese countryside to select a single memory that they can take with them to eternity. Each describes their memory in detail so counselors can film it. The memories are screened at week's end so that they can be re-experienced for eternity. If "heaven" is a single, happy memory from your life, which one would you choose?
