## Friendship Force Club of Sarasota Programs for May, June and July

**May 3** Club members will have 2 programs this evening. First, Yolanda Nandin, a native of Colombia will speak briefly about life in Colombia. She and her American husband Joe now live in Sarasota but they met and married in Colombia many years ago. Her bubbling personality will be a “preview” of the Ambassadors we’ll be hosting later in the month.



The “main event” is entitled “Prominent Figures in the History of Sarasota”. This will be presented by Dr. Ray Young who is the Vice-President for Education with Sarasota Sister Cities Association. Ray is a Professor Emeritus from the University of Wisconsin-Madison where he specialized in natural Products Chemistry and Ethnobotany. He holds degrees from the University of Washington (PhD) and Syracuse University (B.S. & M.S.). He was a Fulbright Scholar in Sweden and a Senior Fulbright Scholar in Greece.

Professor Young has 180 publications including books, book chapters, patents and many original research publications.

Ray and his wife Kathryn are part-time residents of Sarasota. One of Ray’s hobbies, besides Sarasota history and travel, is painting. He recently had a one-man show that was greatly enjoyed by the viewers.

We are fortunate to have this talented man share his research on prominent Sarasotans with us. The goal is to acquire more knowledge on our local history in order to share it with our guests and hosts.

**June 7** Our meeting will take place at the Waldemere Fire House at 7 pm. The guest speaker Dorothy Conlon, a well-seasoned traveler, will share some of her experiences with us. #### Olympic Seattle-Tacoma, Washington - August 9-16

### Tirana, Albania – September 10-28

The exchange to Albania is going to happen. We will be in Tirana on September 11 and meeting our hosts there. To Whispering Sands, Siesta Key

**South bridge** (Stickney Point Rd) --turn right and go north to the Village. Once through the village, on your right will be a gas station with a big red **K**. Turn left there into Whispering Sands. Go straight to the stop sign. Turn left. The clubhouse will be on your right. Pass the clubhouse and continue until you see parking spaces on your left. Park and walk back to the clubhouse (it's not far).

**North bridge** follow signs to Siesta Village. Just before you arrive in the village, there will be a gas station on your left with a big red **K**. Turn right there into Whispering Sands. Go straight to stop sign. Turn left. Clubhouse will be on your right. Pass the clubhouse and continue until you see parking spaces on the left. Park and walk back to clubhouse.
